




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WHAT ARE THE EARLY YEARS?

The moment a child is born all their experiences are learning experiences.



The opportunities and encouragement we give our children in their first eight years of life shape the person they grow up to be.

Even before they are born, babies are ready to learn. Their brains grow faster in the first two years of their life than at any other time.

How our children grow up is not just about how they are cared for at home. It is also about how we in our communities help each other to raise our kids.

WHAT IS THE EARLY YEARS STRATEGY?

The Early Years Strategy is the Western Australian Government's initiative to commit to supporting children, families, carers and communities to improve the well being of our children aged 0 – 8 years of age.

The Early Years Strategy is about encouraging communities to find new ways of working together to help their children get the best start in life.

To ensure that our kids get off to the best start, Kalgoorlie-Boulder formed an Early Years Strategy Group who meet once a month. It is the group's aim to bring the community together through vested interest in our children to develop and implement improvements for the enrichment of our families and children within our community.

INTERESTING BRAIN FACTS

- ◆ Even before we are born we are ready to learn
- ◆ Our brains grow faster in the first two years of life than at any other time
- ◆ The human brain takes in and organizes more information in a day than a computer is capable of processing in a year.
- ◆ The human brain weighs about 3 pounds and is the size of a grapefruit.
- ◆ Our sense of smell is the only sense which sends information directly to the brain.
- ◆ Lavender, chamomile and orange promote relaxation while peppermint, basil and cinnamon increase alertness.
- ◆ It is estimated that the brain receives between 35,000 and 40,000 bits of information per second.

WHAT IS AVAILABLE IN CHILDREN'S SERVICES?

Do you work? Or perhaps just need time out, a break away from the kids? Looking for somewhere your kids can go so they are mixing with other children their own age. Unsure where they can go? Why not look at:-

Family Day Care

Family day care services provide care and developmental activities for small groups of children in the homes of family day carers. Care is flexible and can be matched to suit each families needs and may be available on weekends or overnight if needed. Family Day Care services provide care for children up to 12 years of age.

In Home Care

In-home care is a flexible form of child care where care is provided in the child's home by an approved carer. In-Home Care may be available for families who do not use a standard child care service, or where their child's care needs cannot be met by an existing service. Families that may be eligible for in-home care include:

- ♦ families where the parent/s or child has an illness/disability;
- ♦ families in rural or remote areas;
- ♦ parent/s working shift work or non-standard hours;
- ♦ parents who have had a multiple birth (more than two) and/or have more than two children under school age;
- ♦ breast feeding mothers working from home.

Long Day Care

Long day care is a centre-based form of child care. Long day care services provide quality all day or part-time care for children of working families and the general community. Private operators, local councils, community/not-for-profit organisations, or corporate operators may run these services.

Occasional Care

Occasional care is a unique child care service which supports families by providing flexible care for children from birth to school age. Families can access occasional care regularly or irregularly. Occasional care allows the flexibility to leave children in an early childhood learning environment to socialise and interact with other children.

Outside School Hours Care

Outside school hours care services provide care mainly for primary school children before and/or after school and during vacation time. In some services, care is also provided on pupil-free days during the school term. Some services also provide vacation care or are linked to other vacation care services to provide care for primary school children all year.

Vacation Care


Vacation care services provide care including creative indoor and outdoor activities during the school holidays for primary school children.

Crèche

A crèche is similar to a child care setting where staff will look after your children while you take part in an activity within the complex itself. You will generally find crèche facilities at Gyms / Health Clubs or when you are attending specific training sessions held within the facility.

WHEN CAN MY CHILD START SCHOOL?

What is Early Education?



Early childhood education includes kindergarten, pre-primary and years 1 to 3.

Children must be four by 30th June in the year they go to kindergarten and 5 by 30th June in the year they go to pre-primary.

To enroll your child in any Early Education program please contact your choice of school direct. Some schools may have limitations on enrolments as boundaries or zones regulate some schools.

Currently parents in Kalgoorlie-Boulder have the choice of Government, Independent or Catholic schools.

SUPPORTING CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

Play Group

A playgroup is a group of parents or carers and their young children who meet regularly for interaction and fun. Playgroups are for children from birth to school age and usually each playgroup meets on the same day every week and lasts for about two hours. Playgroups are run by the members themselves and meet in a variety of venues depending on the needs of the group and the availability of suitable premises.

Benefits for Adults


Through playgroup, mothers, fathers, grandparents and other caring adults find the opportunity for;

- ♦ meeting new friends
- ♦ reducing isolation or loneliness
- ♦ developing a new self-confidence
- ♦ having special time with their children
- ♦ discovering new ideas for extra fun at home
- ♦ developing a greater understanding of children and what being a parent and carer is all about
- ♦ building a support network and social contacts

Benefits for Children

Through playgroup children will:

- ♦ have fun with play activities
- ♦ make new friends
- ♦ discover new experiences
- ♦ find out about the world around them
- ♦ gain self confidence and develop self expression
- ♦ learn how to get along with other people
- ♦ be given opportunities to enhance all areas of their physical, social, emotional and cognitive development.
- ♦ Playgroups help children become school ready.



Children's Libraries

All state and community libraries have a children's section. Parents are encouraged to come along and bring their children so they are introduced to books and story telling at a young age. Many libraries run story telling sessions during the week. The programs are designed for young children and their families. Sessions generally include oral stories, story readings, singing and rhyme activities.

Story telling sessions are designed to promote a love of books and stories.

Community Toy Libraries

Community toy libraries offer a wide variety of toys, games and books for loan. Generally you have to become a member of the library before you can borrow any items.

Community and Family Centres

In many communities you will find either a Community House or a Family Centre. These services often offer recreational and learning programs for young children including movement and music, gymnastics, dance or creative play programs. Some services offer programs for children as young as six months.

Some centres even offer extended services such as family counselling and parenting advice.

Parenting and Advice Centres

At these centres you will generally find information including books, videos and brochures on a broad range of childhood topics. Most centres have a service where you will be able to borrow these resources. Most centres also have an open door policy so it is even okay just to pop in for a chat and coffee.

WHAT HEALTH SERVICES ARE AVAILABLE TO ME?



Child Health Clinics

Community Child Health Nurses work from various clinics throughout Kalgoorlie-Boulder. They work with young families to assist and guide parents with the general well being and development of their child. The Child Health Nurses conduct routine health checks from the clinics and can act as a link between hospital, family GP's and other health professionals as required. They also provide nutritional information and child rearing tips when the need arises.

Community Nurses conduct immunisation clinics and a variety of programs that are directed at assisting parents with the demands of adjusting to parenting.

Dental Health

Most primary schools offer free basic dental care to school aged children from pre-primary through to Year 12. The main emphasis of the School Dental Clinic is on prevention, oral health education and early intervention to fix dental problems.

Children with additional needs

There are a wide range of services available to help people with disabilities in the Kalgoorlie – Boulder region.

Most services offer advice and information that enable families to link in with other services. However some services offer respite care which allows time out for a carer of a child with additional needs.

Child care can provide a much-needed break for families caring for a child with additional needs. All children's services have access to an Inclusion Support Facilitator who can assist early childhood educators.

WHAT ARE PAEDIATRIC HEALTH SERVICES?

You will find a team of Allied Health Professionals at your local hospital. They are a committed team of professionals working together to provide integrated assessment and intervention services for children of all ages.

Generally the team will consist of the following;

Speech Pathology

A Speech Pathologist can assist children of all ages with a variety of problems including stuttering, poor vocabulary, problems with both understanding and use of speech. Speech Pathologists may also assist in feeding difficulties and dribbling problems.

Social Worker

Generally you will find a Social Worker or an Aboriginal Liaison Welfare Officer at all major hospitals. They are there to assist inpatients and outpatients and their relatives with health and welfare related issues. The Social Work department provides services associated with carer support, practical welfare support and referrals, crisis support, grief counseling and family support.

Occupational Therapy

Occupational Therapists can assist children's development in areas of play, self-care, school readiness and engaging in school activities. Occupational Therapists specialise in working with children that may have difficulties with fine motor coordination skills or visual perception.

Audiology Therapy

The Audiology Department provides assessment and management of hearing difficulties and associated ear problems, such as: Ringing in the ears "Tinnitus," Middle ear infections "Otitis Media".

Audiologists are also able to provide information on ear care and cleaning.

Physiotherapy

Physiotherapists can assist the gross motor development of children in the following areas:

- Developmental delay
- Development coordination disorder
- Neurological disorders
- Orthopedic problems
- Chest conditions

Services may involve assisting parents with the promotion of development milestones; developing specific muscle strength and endurance; developing programs for children with specific needs for active inclusion; or for the provision of equipment, walking aids, resources and information.

Dietetics Department

The Dietetics Department provides nutritional care to children in hospital and as needed, to outpatients. Major activities include evaluation, screening, counselling and education to parents of infants and children with nutritional concerns.
